## PERMISSION TO GIVE PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION

- The school will only accept medicines which are essential: that is where it would be detrimental to a child's health if the medicines were not given during the school day.
- Medicines **must** be prescribed by a doctor, dentist, nurse prescriber or pharmacist prescriber.
- They <u>must</u> always be provided in the original container as dispensed by a pharmacist and carry a pharmacy label.
- The label should give the child's name, the name of the medicine, how much medicine should be given and how often it should be given.
- Wherever possible, parents should give medicine outside of the school day e.g. if the child needs three doses a day one can be given before school, one on return home from school and one at bedtime.
- Under normal circumstances children should not attend school for the first 48 hours of antibiotic treatment.
- Parents who bring their child to school should hand any medication directly to a member of office staff.
- It is the responsibility of parents to replace medication which has been used or expired at the request of the School Nurse or school staff.
