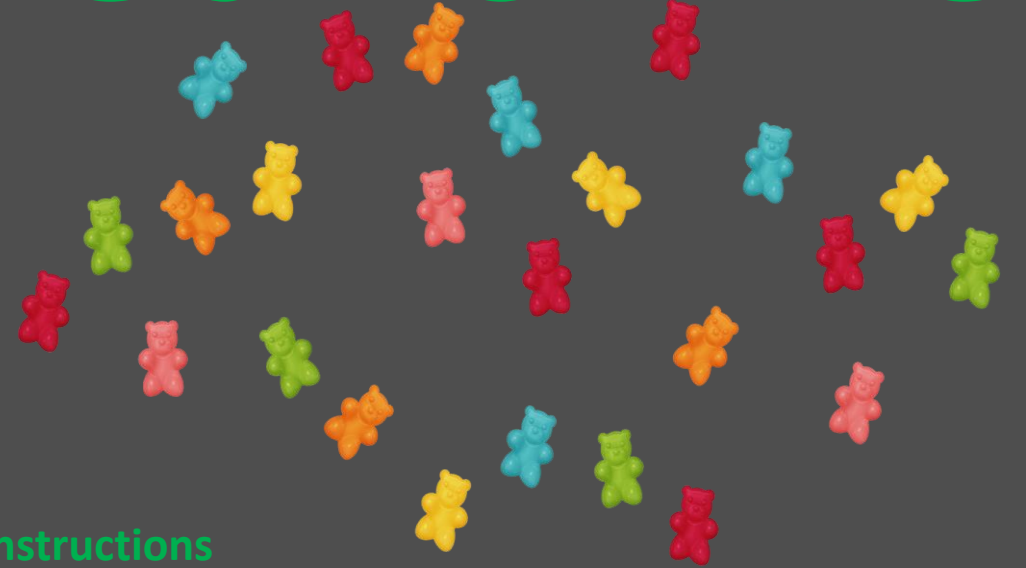

# Gummy bear slime

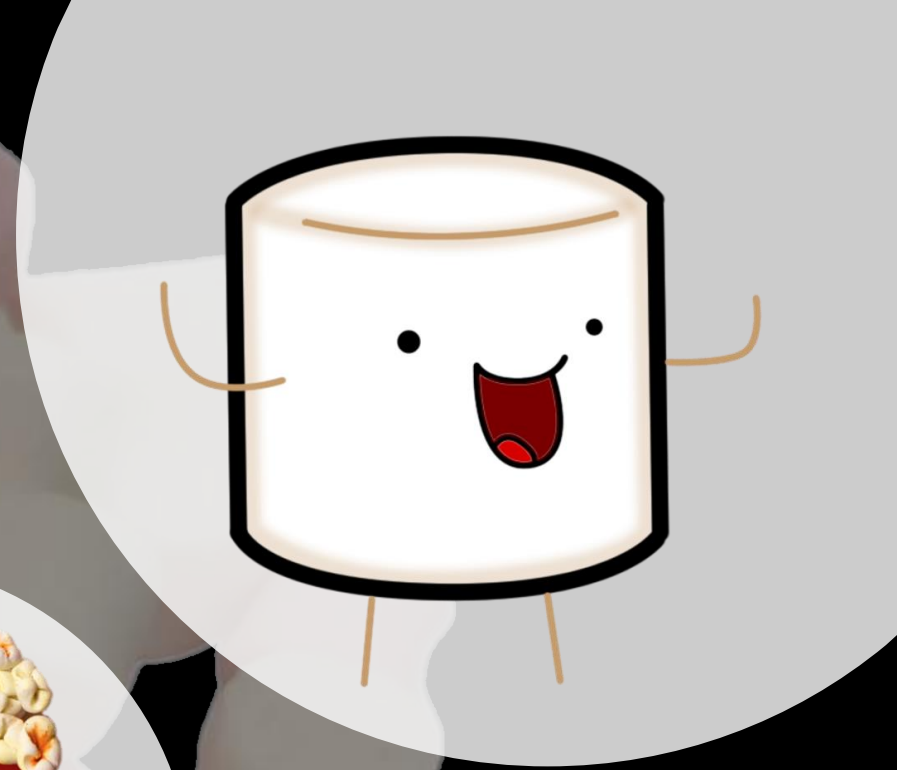


## 1. Instructions

2. Microwave gummy bears in a heat-safe bowl for 10-15 seconds. ...
3. Stir in icing sugar and cornflour in equal amounts, until the gummy bear slime forms a cohesive ball.
4. When your gummy bear slime is too tough to stir with a spoon, finish kneading by hand.
5. Add more cornflour little by little (if needed) so that slime no longer sticks to hands

# Marshmallow and popcorn slime

- **INSTRUCTIONS**
- **Place popcorn in a large bowl. If you like it gooey, use less popcorn.**
- **Melt butter and brown sugar in the microwave. Add marshmallows. Stir until melted and smooth.**
- **Stir in green food colouring.**
- **Pour mixture over popcorn and stir. Sprinkle in the candy eyeballs**



# Marshmallow Slime

**For the marshmallow slime recipe you will need**

- 200g marshmallows
- 70-80 ml coconut oil or vegetable oil
- 170g icing sugar
- 1-2 tsps of sprinkles (optional)
- A few drops of food colouring (optional)

**1** Put the marshmallows into a **heatproof bowl** and **microwave in 20-30 second bursts** until completely melted. **Stir in between.**

**2** Sift in the **icing sugar** and stir in the **oil**. Then mix with a spoon and allow to cool for 5-10 minutes

**3** **Coat your hands in oil** and continue to combine the mixture with your hands. The slime will feel **quite sticky!** Keep adding a **little more oil until** it feels like it can be played with without it getting too sticky

**4** Mix in a **few drops of food colouring** if you'd like coloured slime, and/or 1-2 tsp of sprinkles



# Starburst Slime

- 1 big bag of wrapped Starburst candies
- 1/4 cup corn starch
- 1/4 cup powdered sugar

## How to Make Edible Starburst Slime

Have your children help you unwrap all the Starburst candies and place them into separate microwave-safe bowls according to colour. Mix cornflour and powdered sugar together and sprinkle onto a hard, flat surface. Reserve some to use for your hands while you're working the slime.

Next, melt Starburst candies. I tried using a double boiler, but I like using the microwave better. It's easier for us and I feel it's safer, especially for younger children. However, this isn't a slime recipe your children should do on their own. The Starburst candies get really hot and will cause burns if you're not super careful. We have a 1000-watt microwave and I do 2 rounds of 15 seconds, stirring between. You may need to adjust timing based on your microwave. Once candies are melted, remove from microwave. Repeat for each colour
